TRAINING & EDUCATION:

Military security forces receive months of initial, in-resident, rigorous training in law enforcement and combat tactics. Over the span of a military career, military police further develop and master their skills during real-world peacetime national crisis, natural disasters, and overseas deployments in support of combat military operations. Many will earn industry certifications from the American Board for the Certification in Homeland Security (ABCHS) or the Anti-Terrorism Accreditation Board (ATAB) and a great number will also transition to careers in law enforcement and further their professional development at colleges and universities where they may major in related fields such as Criminal Justice or Homeland
